Treasurer (734) 224-7342

Calls for tax bills, tax payments and sewer bills. (for water call South County Water (734) 847-0579).

Calls relating to valuation of property in Bedford, property records and land divisions.

Calls for building plan review, building permits, and the inspection of all work performed under permits.

Upcoming Meetings

- **March Board of Review Organizational Meeting** will be held on Tuesday, March 2, 2021 from 10:00 am until adjourned.
- **Appeals** will be held on Monday, March 8, 2021 from 1:00 pm – 5:00 pm and 6:00 pm – 9:00 pm and Wednesday, March 10, 2021 from 9:00 am – 12:00 pm and 1:00 pm – 5:00 pm. Additional days will be added if necessary.

GIS

Monroe County has launched a community planning and resource tool on the County's website. This new tool can be used by anyone and contains geographic land information about property in Monroe County. Public information such as ownership, assessed value, and approximate location from a FEMA designated flood hazard area can all be seen in this application. Access to this geographic information is made possible through the County's use of an internet-enabled Geographic Information System: <https://bit.ly/2ESeq3F>.

Small Business Taxpayer Exemption

MCL 211.90 provides for a personal property tax exemption for "eligible personal property". This is commonly referred to as the Small Business Taxpayer Exemption.

The small business taxpayer personal property exemption provides a complete exemption from personal property tax for industrial or commercial personal property when the combined true cash value of all industrial personal property and commercial personal property owned by, leased by or in the possession of the owner or a related entity claiming the exemption is less than \$80,000 in the local tax collecting unit and the property is not leased to or used by a person that previously owned the property or a person that, directly or indirectly controls, is controlled by, or under common control with the person that previously owned the property.

In order to claim the exemption a taxpayer must file Form 5076 Small Business Property Tax Exemption Claim Under MCL 211.90 with the local unit where the personal property is located, no later than February 20th, postmark is acceptable. The burden of proof remains with the taxpayer to demonstrate postmark by February 20.

Beginning in 2019, taxpayers are no longer required to annually file Form 5076 in order to claim the exemption. Once filed and granted, taxpayers will continue to receive the exemption until they no longer qualify for the exemption. At that point, the taxpayer is required to file Rescission Form 5618 and a personal property statement no later than February 20 of the year that the property is no longer eligible.

Failure to file Rescission Form 5618 will result in significant penalty and interest as prescribed by P.A. 132 of 2018: "An owner who fails to file a rescission and whose property is later discovered to be ineligible for the exemption is subject to repayment of any additional taxes with interest at a rate of 1% per month or fraction of a month and penalties compute from the date the taxes were last payable without interest or penalty".

Important Dates

- **January 10, 2021:** Deadline for assessing units to mail **Small Business Personal Property forms** to affected businesses.
- **February 22, 2021:** Deadline for **Small Business Property Tax Exemption Claim form** to be filed with the local assessing unit (postmark is acceptable). ■

2020 WINTER TAX BILLS

The 2020 Winter tax bills were mailed on December 1, 2020, and can be paid any time between December 1, 2020 and February 14, 2021 without late penalty or interest being assessed.

-PLEASE REMEMBER THE FOLLOWING WHEN PAYING YOUR TAX BILLS-

- Please make your check payable to the Bedford Township Treasurer for the exact amount of your tax bill only. We cannot accept overpayments and carry over amounts to future tax bills.
- Please **DO NOT** combine tax payments with sewer payments on one check. Each account is separate, and must be paid by a separate check.
- Please make certain that your check is dated and signed, and that the written amount and the numerical amount are identical.
- We **DO** accept partial payments on tax bills between December 1, 2020 and February 14, 2021. Interest on the unpaid balance must be added after February 15, 2021 since February 14, 2021 falls on a Sunday.
- If you have refinanced your home mortgage or paid off your mortgage in the last year, please call our office. Many times, the banks or mortgage companies do not let us know that you have an escrow account for payment of your property taxes.
- We offer **Direct Debit** or **ACH** payment as an optional method for payment of your taxes. Authorization forms are available in the Treasurer's Department or online at www.bedfordmi.org.
- For your convenience, you may pay your tax bills by mail (*using the envelope provided*), or in person at the **Bedford Township Government Center, 8100 Jackman Road, Temperance, MI 48182** (*convenient drive-up window, drop box or inside service counter*), the **Lambertville Branch office of Fifth Third Bank**, or the **Temperance Branch of First Merchants Bank**.
- Tax bills can also be paid by debit card or credit card (*a 3% user fee is charged*). We are authorized to accept **VISA, MasterCard, Discover Card, and AMEX** cards.
- If your 2020 summer tax bill is not yet paid, there will be interest and penalty assessed. Please visit our website or call the **Bedford Township Treasurer's Department** at (734) 224-7342 for the current balance due.

-PLEASE NOTE-

YOU MAY BE ABLE TO DEFER PAYMENT OF YOUR 2020 WINTER HOMESTEAD PROPERTY TAXES UNTIL APRIL 30, 2021 - IF:

- You are a senior citizen (*age 62 or older*).
- You are an eligible veteran, eligible service person, eligible widow/widower, paraplegic, quadriplegic, hemiplegic, totally and permanently disabled or blind.
- Your total 2020 household income (*taxable and nontaxable*) is \$50,000 or less.
- The taxable value of your homestead does not exceed \$135,000.

In order to qualify for deferred payment of 2020 Winter property taxes, you must file 2020 Michigan Homestead Property Tax Credit form MI-1040CR or MI-1040CR-2 with the State of Michigan, and **provide the Bedford Township Treasurer's office with a copy on or before February 14, 2021. WITHOUT A COPY OF THESE FORMS, THE TOWNSHIP CANNOT GRANT DEFERRED PAYMENT.** If you have any questions regarding deferring payment of your 2020 Winter tax bill, please call the **Bedford Township Treasurer's Department** at (734) 224-7342.

NOTE: Unfortunately, due to the ongoing Covid-19 Pandemic the volunteers from RSVP will not be assisting with the 1040-CR forms (Homestead Tax Credit forms) this year. Please contact Monroe County Opportunity Program (MCOP) at (734) 241-2775 for assistance. ■

Your Bedford Branch of the Monroe County Library System is a great resource for recreation, education, and entertainment during the winter and all year round. We have many digital resources available that you don't need to leave your home to enjoy. Go to <https://monroe.lib.mi.us/downloadable-content> for detailed information and access. Here's just a highlight of what you can access with your library card.

Woodland's Downloadable Library – Using the Libby app, (*which is connected to BPS Sora service*) find books and audiobooks to read or listen.

Hoopla – Books, audiobooks, music, television shows, comics, and movies all in one place with no waiting!

Kanopy – Provides thoughtful entertainment, including movies and educational programs for all ages.

Plus we are open for curbside service. What does that mean? You can call us to arrange for pick-up of library materials (*books, movies, music, audiobooks, and yes, even art*) and we'll get them checked out to your card and brought outside for you. We have some weather-safe boxes to put your items in for you to retrieve. Not sure what you want to read, watch, or listen to? Fill out one of our Reading Recommendations sheets and we'll find something for you. Go to <https://mymclsmi.wufoo.com/forms/q1r8lu0r0frmjc9/> for the form.

We deliver copy, fax, wi-fi printing, and scanning services curbside and have set up computers in our lobby area for public use. To arrange for a one-hour appointment for computer use, please call us at (734) 847-6747. Cost for services are as follows:

Copies – 10 cents per page for black & white, 50 cents per page for color

Fax – First 3 pages no charge. Every page over 3, 50 cents per page

Wi-fi printing or printing from a computer – First 10 black & white pages no charge. Over 10 pages, 10 cents per page. All printing in color 50 cents page.

Scanning to email – No charge

To use our wi-fi printing, send the item you need printed to print@ricohprintcloud.com. You will receive a message back with a code for each item you need printed. Call the library at (734) 847-6747 and give us those codes. We will retrieve the items and bring them out to you curbside when you arrive. Please note: If you have many items to print, it does take a bit of time. We ask for your patience.

A Message From Bedford Township

Bare Perspective

WINTER is a great time to evaluate your landscaping and gardens. First, are they providing enough interest during the winter months? Great garden design enhances your

house and property year round. Second, do your gardens have good "bones"? Gardens need good basic structure and there is no better time to look at this than now, when your yard is relatively bare.



If your summer gardens are filled only with herbaceous perennials and annuals, consider adding some shrubs and small trees that can be grown in their natural forms. Or think about ornamental hardscaping such as tuteurs and trellises on which to grow vines, or perhaps an outdoor sculpture. Not only do they create some winter interest, but also provide solid bones for the garden, which leaves and flowers will later flesh out.



In winter you can also clearly see the branches of trees and shrubs and late winter is generally a good time to prune. Concentrate on eliminating dead wood and crossing or injured branches, or thinning to produce a more open, graceful habit. Note, however, that for spring blooming woody plants, if you prune back hard at this time to control size, you will be eliminating flower buds. ■

2020 ELECTION

YEAR

THE 2020 ELECTION YEAR has ended and the voting equipment has been stowed away. Bedford Township will see its next election in May 2021. It has been a long and challenging year, not only for my department, but for all residents of Bedford Township who have been inundated with political signs, literature and ads for so many months.

I wish to thank the **Assembly of Christians Church, Bedford Branch Library, Christ the King Lutheran Church, Compelled Church, Northwest Christian Church, Our Lady of Mount Carmel Catholic Church, Shelton Park Church of God, St. Luke's Lutheran Church,** and the **United Methodist Church** for allowing us to use their facility as a precinct location from 6:00 am until after the polls close, at no cost to the township, many even allowing us in the day before so that special care could be taken to allow for safety protocols due to the COVID-19 virus.

In closing, I also wish to thank our voters for their patience as they waited in line to vote and wish everyone a **Merry Christmas, Happy Holidays,** and a **Wonderful New Year!** ■

A Note From Your ORDINANCE DEPARTMENT

"SAVE OUR SENIORS" is a program designed to help senior citizens with a health and/or debilitating issue, when they receive a written complaint about blight or snow removal from our Ordinance Department. If a senior citizen receives a written letter of complaint from the Bedford Ordinance Department, they should contact our office as soon as possible, a member of the Ordinance Department will then set up a meeting in person with you to determine if you meet the requirements of the program. Upon meeting the requirements, our citizen volunteers are then contacted and will work with you to get the matter resolved.

"SNOW REMOVAL". With winter approaching, snow and ice removal from sidewalks in front of homes can sometimes be a problem. **Ordinance #52** requires all property and/or business owners to remove any accumulating snow or ice within 24 hours after the snowfall occurs. If you are a senior citizen, and again get a notice from the Ordinance Department regarding snow removal on a sidewalk and you are unable to take care of the task let us know right away. If you do not contact our office, we will assume you are able to take care of the matter and are simply not willing to comply. This will result in our contracted service taking care of the sidewalks and you will be billed on your tax bill.



"SNOWBIRD HOUSE CHECKS" is a program for residents who plan to be out of town for an extended amount of time, two weeks or more, during the months of November thru March. An officer from our department will make periodic, exterior checks of your residence while you are gone, then upon your return you would simply call our department to remove you from our list. This program **IS NOT** a replacement for our current law enforcement, and should any type of criminal activity be discovered during an inspection, law enforcement is notified, along with an emergency contact and the homeowner. For matters not a of a criminal nature, the homeowner and their emergency contact will be notified. Interested residents should stop by the Ordinance Department at township hall and fill out the paperwork to be placed on our house check list, there is **NO** fee.
